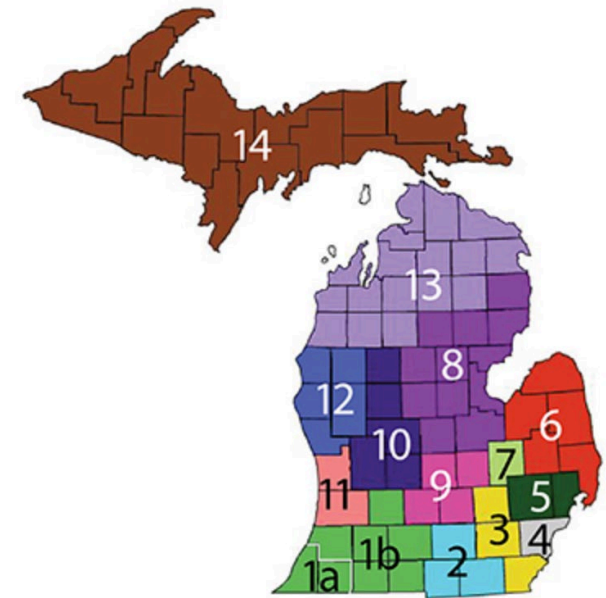



Background

- Disability Network is a collective of 15 community-based organizations federally established as Centers for Independent Living
- Served 43,000 people with disabilities last year
- Educated 70,000 people
- Purpose: Assist people with disabilities live independently in their community, fully participate, be treated equally and have opportunities to achieve economic self-sufficiency

Current Population Survey- Annual Social and Economic Supplement -CPS-ASEC

- Main source of official employment and income stats in US
- 50,000 households (150,000 non-institutionalized households)
- “Does anyone in the household have a health problem or disability that prevents them from working or which limits the the kind or amount of they can do?”
- Major Advantage-allows for state-level estimates and length of time the disability question has been asked (since 1981)

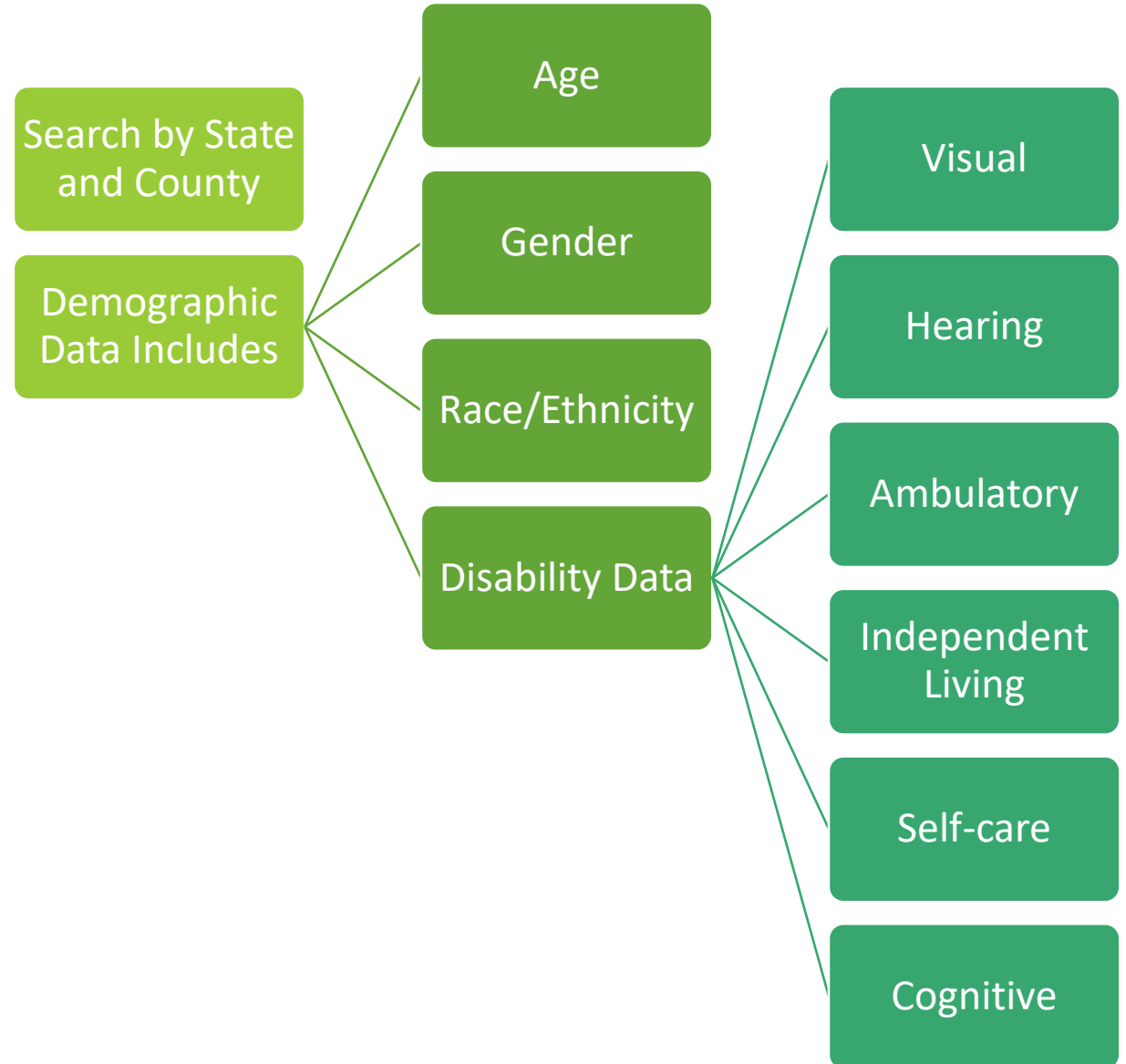


American Community Survey-ACS

- Continuous Data Effort by the US Census Bureau which started in 2005
- Provides annual information on demographics, housing, social, and economic statistics
- Data is comparable across states, communities and population
- Main purpose is to provide governments with an information base for the administration and evaluation of programs.

American Community Survey



National Institute on Health Survey



- Conducted by CDC
- Been used since 1957
- Cross-sectional survey of 100,000 non-institutionalized people
- Conducted via in-person interviews
- Monitors trends in illness, analyzes access to healthcare & health insurance and evaluates federal health programs

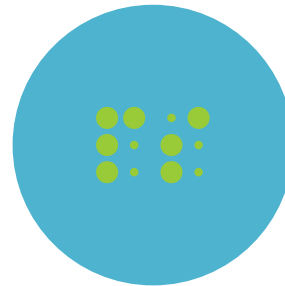




Disability in the US

Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP)

- Conducted by US Census Bureau
- Longitudinal survey of 14,000-36,700 households
- Same people are followed monthly for 2 ½ years
- Dynamic analysis of employment and program participation
- Daily activities, work limitations and limited health condition and impairment categories
