Emergency Operations for Tribal Governments course (L581) May 19-22, 2020

from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Odawa Casino Resort Ovation Hall 1760 Lears Road Petoskey, MI



Course Purpose: To assist Tribal officials to develop organizational structures, operational procedures, and resources for effective emergency operations.

This 4-day course provides tribal emergency management/response personnel, tribal government employees, and tribal leaders with a deeper understanding of emergency operations. Special emphasis is placed on the implementation of an integrated emergency management and operations program as outlined in the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), key operational activities, resource management, and personnel roles using Incident Command System (ICS) principles. The course promotes the integration of emergency operations across all functional agency lines and enhancing the tribes' overall response for all emergencies, regardless of hazard, size, or complexity.

Please note that completion of <u>E/L 580</u>, Emergency Management Framework for Tribal Governments, is a <u>mandatory prerequisite for this class</u>. You will need to bring your <u>completion date for the E/L580 course to the class to put on your application</u>.

AUDIENCE: tribal community response personnel, tribal emergency managers, tribal planners, and tribal leaders.

NOTE: Completion of E/L580 is a mandatory prerequisite

Travel expenses are the responsibility of each student

Students completing the course receive an EMI Certificate of Completion for 2.4 CEUs in the mail after the course is completed. The training and materials are free.

NOTICE: You will be required to enter a FEMA Student Identification Number (SID) on your EMI application on the first day of class. PRIOR TO THE CLASS. If you completed the 580 prior to 2013 and don't have an SID, please go to https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid/ to obtain one. PLEASE BE SURE
